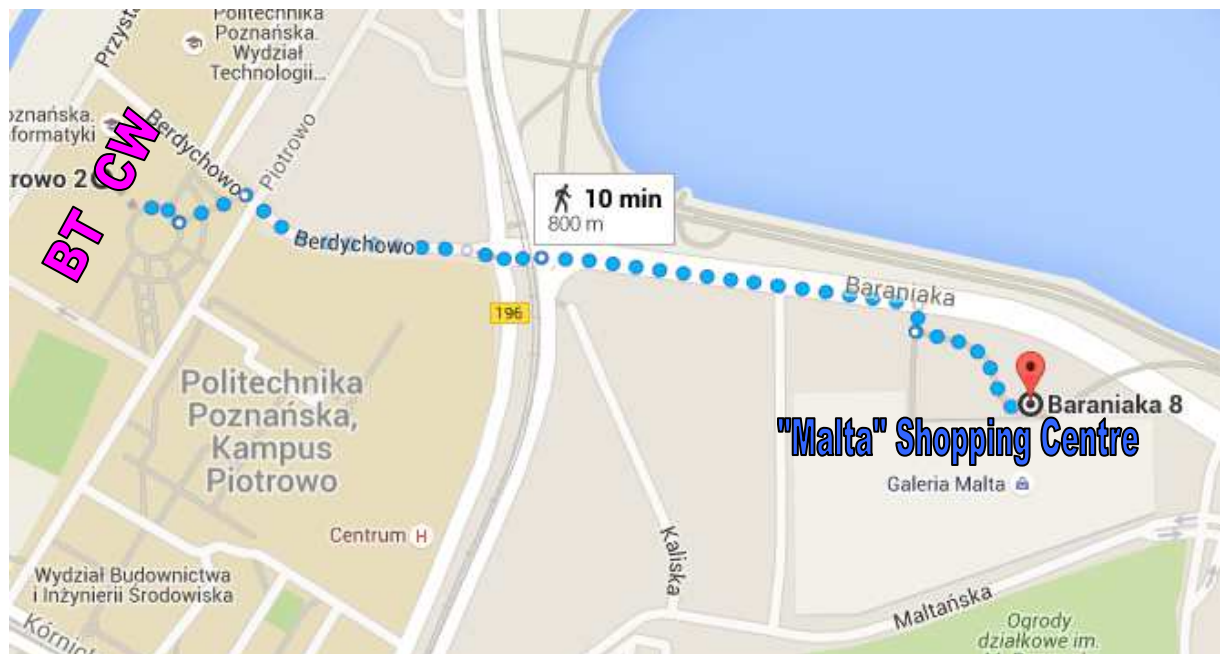
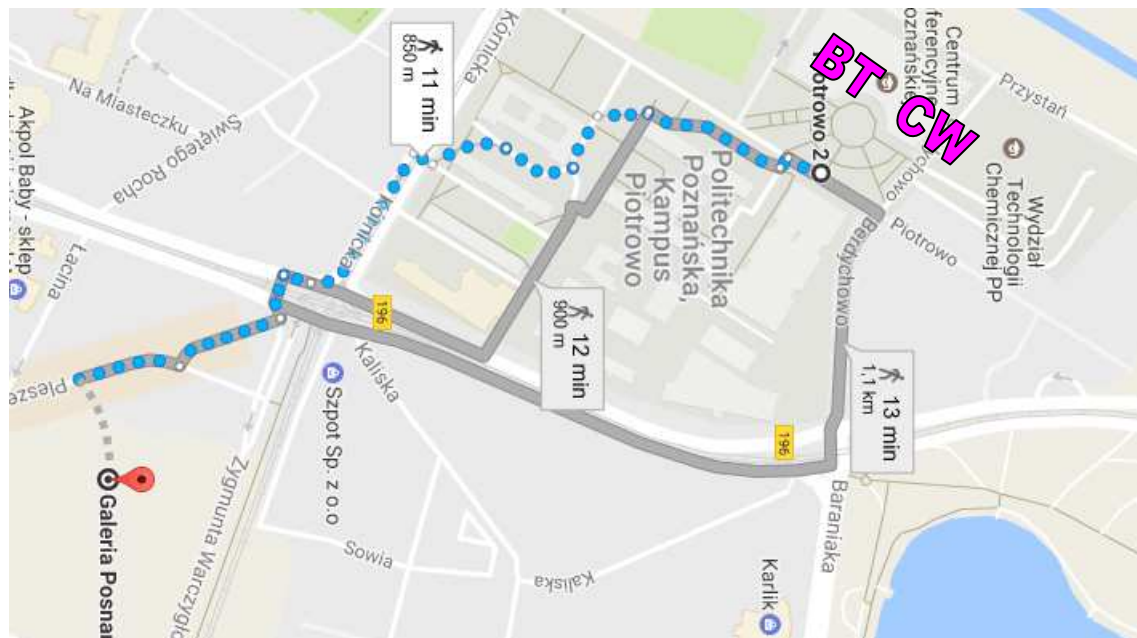


## “Galeria Malta”

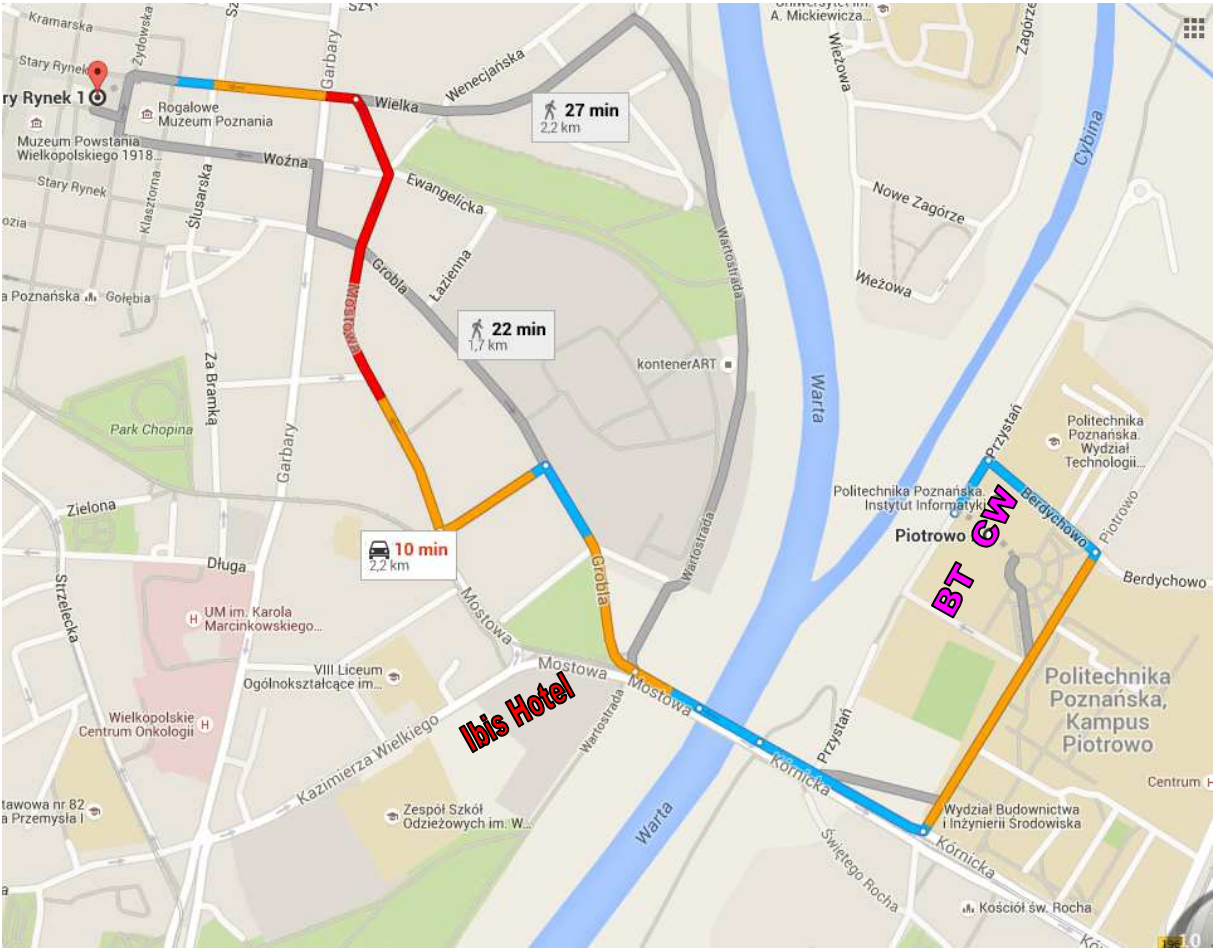
## “Galeria Posnania”



Our next closest ‘bigger lunch’ destination (900m /as opposed to “Malta” -- 800m/) with even bigger assortment shops, cafes and restaurants.

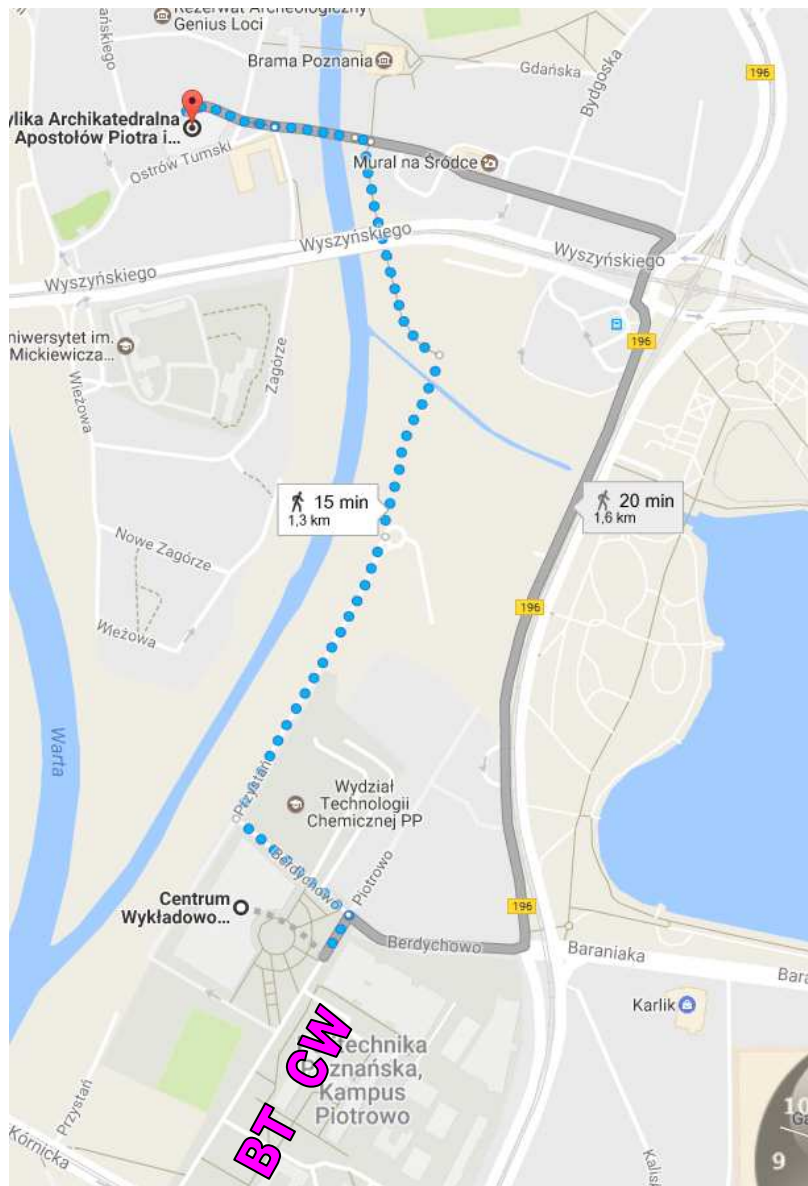
<sup>1</sup> ‘Malta’ is the name of the lake across the road, the name of which is related to the Mediterranean island Malta, in result, one can visit Malta without leaving Poznań

“Stary Rynek”



At “Stary Rynek” (“Old Market”) you will find an assortment of restaurants, bars/pubs and boutiques (with more of them in the surrounding streets).

Katedra Poznańska /Bazylika Archikatedralna św. Piotra i św. Pawła w Poznaniu/  
(Poznań Cathedral /The Archcathedral Basilica of St. Peter and St. Paul in Poznań/)



One of the oldest churches in Poland located at Ostrów Tumski<sup>2</sup>, (unfortunately) rebuilt several times; however, you can still catch a glimpse of the original ruins in the Basilica basement.

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<sup>2</sup> Ostrów Tumski, literally “Cathedral Island” (“tum”: as the German “Dom”, “ostrów”: “island” /old polish/), shows (very much like “Malta”) that one does not have to leave Poznań to set foot on an island (notice that Ostrów Tumski is a strip of land between the river Warta and its branch Cybina, which splits from Warta just off the Centrum Wykładowe only to join it again about a mile downstream)
